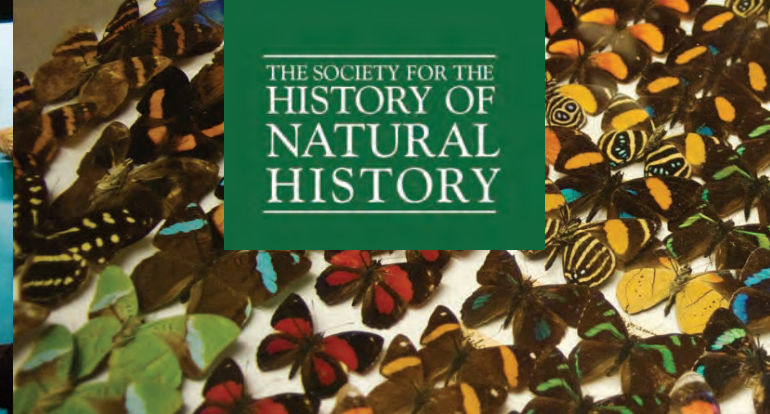

Membership Benefits

Archives of natural history

Archives is an internationally respected journal containing refereed, illustrated papers on the history and bibliography of natural history for all periods and cultures. It is published twice a year by Edinburgh University Press.

All members have free online access to *Archives* and all back issues from 1936 through the Edinburgh University Press website.

Members do not pay page charges on papers accepted for publication in *Archives*.

Newsletter

The *Newsletter* is issued twice a year. It announces forthcoming events, provides a forum for notes and queries, offers notice of new publications, and much more.

Meetings

Members receive reduced registration rates to Society meetings and invitations to those we co-sponsor.

Discounts on publications

Members normally receive reduced rates on the Society's special publications. Members also are entitled to discounts on publications issued by Edinburgh University Press.



Membership Categories

All members who have paid an annual subscription are entitled to vote at general meetings and to stand for election to Council, the Society's governing body. They also receive all discounts available to members.

Individual membership

Members receive single print copies of *Archives of natural history* and the *Newsletter* and free online access to all back issues of *Archives*.

Dual membership

For two people living at the same address. Receive one printed copy of *Archives of natural history*, free online access to all back issues of *Archives*, and the *Newsletter*.

For individuals who are full-time or part-time students. Proof of enrolment may be requested. Receive the *Newsletter* and free online access to the current issue of *Archives* and all back issues.
